



## **Prevent duty and British values**

Our Nurseries will demonstrate strong British Values such as

- **Democracy**  
Making decisions together, encouraging children to see their role, to know their views count, value the views and values of others and to talk about feelings
- **Rule of law**  
Understanding rules matter. Ensure children understand their own behaviour and the behaviour of others has consequences, help them to learn the difference between right and wrong.  
Collaborate with children when developing rules and codes of behaviour and help them to understand the rules apply to everyone
- **Individual liberty**  
Freedom for all. Help children develop a positive sense of self, provide opportunity to develop self- esteem, self-knowledge, and confidence.  
Encourage talk about feelings and differences, reflect on differences and support differences of opinion.
- **Mutual respect and tolerance**  
Treat others as you want to be treated. Create an ethos of inclusivity and tolerance where views, faiths, cultures, and races are valued, and children engage with the wider community.  
Discuss similarities and differences and share experiences and traditions.  
Explain the importance of tolerance and respecting others, promote diversity, for example sharing stories, providing resources and activities which challenge stereo typing.

With this guidance we are helping children to become compassionate and considerate towards others. This will form part of a fair and equal society.

We will demonstrate these values through our staff and the early year's foundation stage. Through our policies and procedures, we will bring equality, behaviour, safeguarding, and the British values which the prevent duty is consistent with.

Through this policy we share these values and make sure our staff understand it and act appropriately within it.

We will focus on children's personal, social and emotional development ensuring children learn from right and wrong, mix and share with other children, value others' views/ know about differences between themselves and others.

Staff will always be alert to harmful behaviours of concern, by influential adults in a child's life. This may include discriminatory and/or extremist discussions between parents, family, and other staff members. Staff to identify any children who may be vulnerable towards radicalisation and know what to do if they are identified.

We will assess the risk of children been drawn into terrorism and work in partnership with local partners such as the local police, Bradford Partnership working together to safeguard children and Ofsted. We will also inform the relevant people if children are off for long periods of time and who do not Inform/ contact the nursery. (We will contact parents/carers if a child is absent from nursery the same day, and record the information)

Management will also complete duty of care training online; all staff to complete prevent training within six weeks of working at nursery. This will also be in line with completing a safeguarding and FGM courses.
